




Q1 What is the grade of the child for whom you are completing this survey?


Q2 How many children do you have at this school?


Q3 How far does your child live from school?


Q4 On most days, how does your child arrive at and leave from school?


Q5 How long does it normally take your child to get to/from school?








Q7 My child already walks or bikes to/from school.




Q11 Would you probably let your child walk or bike to/from school if this problem were changed or improved?








Q13 How much fun is walking or biking for your child?

Q14 How healthy is walking or biking for your child?



However to get to Grant my child would need to either walk along Whitrock or South Park Drive then cross over 80th St. I will never allow her to walk/bike along Whitrock; our neighbor was killed biking along Whitrock. For it to be safe Whitrock would need sidewalks, and then a crossing guard at 80th. For her to take the South Park Drive route it would eliminate the need for a sidewalk since there isn't the traffic volume, but again then at 80th there would need to be a crossing guard (or I guess at least a traffic light that would stop traffic). The ideal would be sidewalks (not a bike lanesidewalks!! Bike lanes still have you walking/biking right next to the traffic and there needs to be safe separation between walkers/bikers and traffic!) all along the whole length of Whitrock for the general safety of everyone. Plus, it makes neighborhoods much more walkable, and it could even connect to the route around the lake. In a year or so, my child would probably love to bike or walk up to the gas station on the corner of 80th and Whitrock, less than a mile from our home, but I will never allow that due to the traffic speed and volume on Whitrock with no sidewalks that allow for a safe route with separation from traffic.
